## A message from our Headteacher

Dear Comber Grove families

Our current whole school attendance is significantly below the National expectation of 95.6%. It is important that your child/ren attend school on time every day.

## Attendance Matters!

All parents and carers want the very best for their children and for them to aet on well in life. Having a good education is important to ensure that children have the best opportunities in their adult life. They only get one chance at school, and your child's future may be affected by not attending school regularly. If children do not attend school

regularly, they may:

- Struggle to keep up with schoolwork. In a busy school day, it is difficult for schools to always find the extra time to help children to 'catch up' with lost learnina.
- They may not achieve their full potential.
- Children miss the social side of school life. Poor attendance often affects their friendship groups. Children with lower attendance are more likely to find it difficult to make and keep friends – a vital part of growing up.

Setting good attendance patterns from an early age, from nursery and throughout their school journey will also help your child later in their life. Children who have poor school attendance records may have less chance of securing a job when they are adults.

We are here to help and want to work in partnership with you. Please contact the school office and ask to speak to Paula Trent (Family Support Worker), if you need support or are concerned about your child's attendance.

Persistent Absence: Please note that parents have a legal responsibility to inform the school of any absences. If a child's attendance drops below 90% they are considered 'persistently absent' and the school will request a meeting with parents or carers. At this point, the school may consult with the Education and Inclusion Team to discuss attendance concerns.

- Ensuring all staff understand the symptoms of child abuse and neglect
- ✓ Referring any concerns to social care
- Monitoring children who are the subject of child protection plans
- Maintaining accurate and secure child protection records

If your child will be five between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2024 (date of birth 1.9.18 – 31.8.19) you need to apply for a school place. 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## **Our Class Names**

We understand the importance of representation and children learning both about and from a diverse range of people. Our classes are each named after role models, both current and from history, of people we can draw inspiration from.

We have tried as much as possible to name our classes after people from our local community. This is to broaden horizons and allow the children to see people from their own community who have broken barriers and helped us (in many different ways!).

#### Nursery - David Bowie Class

David Bowie was a musician and pop culture icon from South East London whose popularity never saw its cessation. David Bowie was a hero because he has worked for countless charities, influenced multiple contemporary artists, and still remained humble while doing so.

## **Reception – Maggie Aderin-Pocock**

Margaret Ebunoluwa Aderin-Pocock (MBE) is a British space scientist and science educator. She was born in London to Nigerian parents, and was raised in Camden, London. Her middle name Ebunoluwa comes from the Yoruba words "ebun" meaning "gift" and Oluwa meaning "God", which is also a variant form of the word "Oluwabunmi" or "Olubunmi", meaning "gift of God" in Yoruba.

### Year 1 - Benjamin Zephaniah

Benjamin Zephaniah is a British writer and poet, who is known for his poetry as well as novels, plays, and other works. His poetry is called "dub poetry," which means that is performed—the words are recited over the beat of reggae music. His work is funny, gritty and inspires us to follow his example as a writer!

## Year 2 - David Attenborough

Sir David Attenborough has inspired millions by bringing the natural world into our homes. He fights for nature and against climate change, with his educational and awe-inspiring work and documentaries.







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### Year 3 – Mo Farah

Sir Mohamed Muktar Jama Farah (CBE) is a British ong-distance runner. His ten global championship gold medals (four Olympic and six World titles) make him the most successful male track distance runner ever, and he is the most successful British track athlete in modern Olympic Games history.

#### Year 4- Marcus Rashford

Marcus Rashford (MBE) is an English professional footballer who plays as a forward for Premier League club Manchester United and the England national team. He is a campaigner against racism, homelessness and child hunger in the United Kingdom.

### Year 5/6 – Mae Jemison

Mae Carol Jemison is an American engineer, physician, and former NASA astronaut. She became the first black woman to travel into space when she served as a mission specialist aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavour.

#### Year 6 - Olive Morris Olive Elaine Morris was a Jamaican-born British-based community leader and activist in the feminist and anti-racism campaigner. She was an inspiring and prolific community activist in South London in the 1970s.



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
