

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Children's Mental Health Awareness Week THEME: 'Let's Connect!'



What can you do at home to support your child?

- Connect with your child in everyday ways
- Talk to your child about important connections
- Talk to your child about their friends
- Connect by taking an interest in your child's world
- Find time to connect as a family
- Try to resolve conflict and re-connect after arguments

Let your child know that if they are worried about something, they should always talk to an adult they trust. It could be you, someone in your family, a teacher or someone else in our school.

If you're worried about your child's mental health you can talk to your GP or someone at school.





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Free School Meals Eligibility Checker

Some parents confuse Healthier Free School Meals with Free School Meals

Healthier Free School Meals = At the moment all Children in Southwark's Primary Schools, are entitled to a meal at school for which they do not have to pay. [This will not continue for ever].

Free School Meals = Children from Reception age upwards whose parents are on benefits or low waged may be entitled to have a meal at school which is **free** [Please note: NOT nursery]

FSM

Due to the rising cost of living everyone could use a bit of help.

If you are on a low income or on benefits, then you may be able to claim free school meals for your child. While all Southwark primary school children are able to access free meals via their healthy schools meal programme, for those children who have a statutory entitlement to free meals, an additional funding called Pupil Premium is allocated from the Department for Education. This funding is paid directly to a school to improve the quality of children's education. It benefits you as a family as well as us as a school. There will be some occasions when we will be able to offer half fees instead of the full costs e.g. school trips or residential school journeys etc.,

It only takes a few minutes to complete, and you receive a certificate of eligibility which you can then share with us so that we can access the funding.

Follow the simple instructions as listed here:

- 1. Click Check my eligibility
- 2. Click Proceed, create a new account
- 3. Click Drop down box Local Authority Insert Southwark
- 4. Click Drop down box School Insert Comber Grove Primary School
- 5. Read terms before you can use the Free School Meals Eligibility Checker, you need to read and accept the Privacy Notice by ticking the box
- 6. Input your details: You must complete <u>all</u> of the boxes paying particular attention to those in the green area, which indicates information that is matched against DWP/HMRS data
- 7. Results will show at the bottom. If successful, it will be Green. Download certificate and email to Susan Roberts- sroberts@combergrove.southwark.sch.uk or bring the certificate in to the school marked for the attention of Mr Black.

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Free School Meals

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces

At Comber Grove Primary School, we get an extra £1,385 (for primary schools) for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.

For example, we've previously used pupil premium funding for:

- Educational provision/resources
- Academic interventions
- Wellbeing and self-esteem building interventions

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Your child might also be eligible if you're in a household with no recourse to public funds (NRPF), subject to a maximum income threshold. This is for children of:

- Zambrano and Chen carers (non-EEA nationals caring for a British citizen residing in the UK)
- British National (Overseas) passport holders





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- Spousal visa, work visa, or student visa holders
- Those with no immigration status
- Families with a right to remain in the UK under Article 8 of the European Convention of Human Rights
- Families receiving support under Section 17 of the Children Act 1989 who are subject to a no recourse to public funds restriction
- Certain failed asylum seekers supported under Section 4 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Universal infant free school meals

Currently, pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school meal thanks to a different government funding scheme known as universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You shouldn't confuse UIFSM with free school meals and the pupil premium.

If your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2 and is eligible for free school meals according to the criteria above, you should still register because we'll receive the extra pupil premium funding.

Does my child have to eat the free school meals?

No. Pupils who are registered for free school meals don't have to eat them. If you're eligible but you want your child to have packed lunches you should still register because the school will receive the funding which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?

You only need to register once at the school.

To register, please contact the school office and we will assist you with your application.

More information

For more information about pupil premium go to our website, which contains details of how the pupil premium has been spent in the past academic year and how it will be spent this year.

The information that you supply to register for Pupil Premium will be held securely and will only be used for the purpose of establishing entitlement to Pupil Premium and to contact other sources, as allowed by law, to verify your initial and continuing entitlement.

If in receipt of Pupil Premium funding, you must notify Comber Grove Primary School in writing of any changes to your financial circumstances.



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Discounted Zoo tickets

We want as many people as possible to be able to enjoy a brilliant day out with us, to benefit from the amazing animals which live at London Zoo, connect with nature and help us create a world where wildlife thrives.

To help people who might find cost or other challenges a barrier to visiting London Zoo, our Community Access Scheme (CAS) provides discounted tickets.

Tickets from as little as £3 per person

Help for Households

We know how hard things are for many families on low incomes right now, and we want to do what we can to help.

As part of our Community Access Scheme, you can now buy reduced price tickets for London Zoo at our entry kiosks from as little as £3 per person, if you are receiving Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, Income Support or Jobseeker's Allowance.

The £3 tickets are available for the whole family (under 3's go free), only at the zoo entrance (not online) from 11am every day of the week, and the current offer runs until the end of March 2023.

You'll need to bring your proof of benefit letter with you to the zoo when you buy your tickets(s) from our friendly staff at the admissions gate (this can be an electronic copy if you prefer).

Unfortunately, we won't be able to issue discounted tickets unless you are able to show one of the above documents (per household) as proof of eligibility.

The Help for Households offer has proved very popular, so please be prepared to queue to enter the Zoo, especially at peak times like weekends and during school holidays. To minimise waiting time we recommend arriving later in the day, or if possible choosing to visit at off-peak times.
