Stage 2 Consultation of proposal to close Comber Grove Primary School

Dear Comber Grove families,

There seems to be a lot of confusion and mixed messages among our community.

As has been widely reported, in recent years many inner and greater London boroughs, including Southwark, have been experiencing a significant decrease in pupil numbers. The plummeting rolls have had a huge impact on our state-maintained schools, which receive money from central government based on the number of pupils they have. Fewer children means less funding.

Thank you all for sharing your opinions during the Stage 1 informal consultation.

On Monday, 4th March 2024, Councillor Jasmine Ali wrote to all Comber Grove families following her meeting with you on 8th February 2924 and said that the consultation will now progress to stage 2 (Publication).

To date, we have not received any paperwork or notice from the Council to commence the formal Stage 2 Consultation. We will share this information if and when it is sent to the school.

I want to personally thank you for your patience, commitment to our children and support of Comber Grove Primary School during this very unsettling period. Although a few families (12 children) have left us since January 2024, the majority of children are still attending school and enjoying their learning. We are trying our best to keep their learning a priority and enjoy our time with them.

If you have any questions or are feeling anxious about the whole process and uncertainty of the future, please reach out to us so that we can either signpost you or provide you with accurate information which we have access to.

Once again, THANK YOU for all your support during this very uncertain time.
