The decision to propose closure of Comber Grove Primary School has been taken to protect the education of children attending the school, and ensure that, should the school close they can have a managed transition to another primary school. Southwark Council acknowledge that the closure of any school will have an impact on the community, and be deeply felt by many families/local residents due to the significant, community links and emotional ties developed and held by generations at Comber Grove Primary School. However, given the level of capacity at across Southwark as a whole, families will be able to access alternative school places in the community.
